Loganville Borough Mayor's Report – March 2026

Mayor Report Summary:

- Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) Report: none received

- Emergency Management (EM):
 - Fire Police Requests: none received
 - Weather Emergencies:
 - Starting on Friday, February 20, York County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) began providing numerous National Weather Service (NWS) weather briefings preceding prior to Winter Storm (WS) Hernando. OEM then issued WebEOC Incident Number 15479 - INITIAL-Heavy Snow-York County, *County Wide* which I passed to the Borough Council (BC) President and Vice President. With updated forecasts, I issued a Snow Emergency Declaration (SED) on Saturday, February 21 for WS Hernando effective from 5pm Saturday through 5pm Monday, as snow was to begin in the early of Sunday, February 22.

- Miscellaneous:

- On Monday, February 9, I was notified that the replacement flag for Goodling Park had arrived at Representative Jones' office, so I pocked it up that day. It is once again flying at Goodling Park.
- Ordinance Enforcement Summary:
 - The fire hydrant on the Dollar General property (231N Main Street) was inaccessible after WS Fern and the property owner was notified to clear it at the end of last month. It was cleared on Monday, February 2.
 - Per my notification of Truist Bank last month of the six abandoned vehicles at their property at 234 North Main Street, all had been removed by Friday, February 13.
 - On the afternoon of Tuesday, February 24 after WS Fernando, I received two complaints of unshoveled sidewalks at 12 Westridge Drive and 10 Highland Road. At 2:30pm, I went to 12 Westridge Drive, where I could hear music playing and rang the doorbell once and knocked on the door twice, but there was no answer. At 2:45pm I visited 10 Highland Road and explained the circumstances to one of the owners about their sidewalk and I was informed that it would be addressed. It was cleared the next day. I was notified and picked up the door hangers from Wolf Printing on the afternoon of Wednesday, February 25. I returned to 12 Westridge Drive on Thursday, February 26 and the sidewalk was cleared.
