Loganville Borough Mayor's Report – February 2025

Issues/Concerns/Requests: none

Mayor Report Summary:

- Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) Report: none received
- District Court Reports: none received
- Emergency Management (EM):
 - Fire Police Requests: none received
 - Weather Emergencies:
 - York County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) provided numerous National Weather Service weather briefings throughout the month, of which the most significant were passed to Borough Council (BC).
 - On Sunday, January 5, I issued a Snow Emergency Declaration (SED) for Winter Storm (WS) Blair in effect from 5:00 PM, January 5-5:00 PM, Tuesday, January 7.
 - On Saturday, January 18, I participated in a Winter Weather/Extreme Cold Coordination Call with York County OEM at 4:00 PM.
 - York County OEM issued Web Emergency Operations Center (WebEOC) Incident 12482, Winter Storm and Extreme Cold-Countywide on Saturday, January 18, at 4:58 PM.
 - On Saturday, January 18, I issued a SED for WS Demi to be effective from 5:00 PM, January 18-Noon, Monday, January 20.
 - York County OEM WebEOC Incident 12482 was closed on Thursday, January 30 at 10:14 AM.
- Meetings/Training:
 - York County OEM quarterly EMC Training was held on Wednesday, January 8 from 6:00-8:30 PM.

- Correspondence:

- On Wednesday, January 15, I received a letter from the York County Board of Elections regarding the 2025 Municipal Primary. It indicates under Title 25, Section 2864, "it is the duty of the clerks or secretaries of the various cities, boroughs, towns,..." "...to send a written notice setting forth..." "...all offices to be filled". The written notice is due to the County Board of Elections on or before Tuesday, February 18.
- On Wednesday, January 15, I mailed Warning Letters to three (3) residents for having vehicles parked on the street alongside their houses during the SED that was in effect for WS Blair in violation of Loganville Ordinance 2010-01, *Parking During Declared Snow Emergencies*, December 6, 2010 with amending Ordinance 2022-01, December 5, 2022.
- On Wednesday, January 22, I mailed Warning Letters to four (4) residents for having vehicles parked on the street alongside their house during the SED that was in effect for WS Demi in violation of Loganville Ordinance 2010-01, *Parking During Declared Snow Emergencies*, December 6, 2010 (with amendment). In addition, one (1) Warning Letter was delivered on Friday, January 24 to a resident for violation of Loganville Ordinance 2014-01, *Removal of Snow and Ice From Sidewalks*, May 5, 2014, as prescribed by the ordinance. The resident removed the snow the same day.
- On Thursday, January 23, I provided Fine Letters (1st Offense) to the Borough Constable for three (3) residents who had vehicles parked on the street alongside their houses during the SED that was in effect for WS Demi in violation of Loganville Ordinance 2010-01, *Parking During Declared Snow Emergencies*, December 6, 2010 (with amendment). These residents already had been provided Warning Letters for previous SEDs. The Constable served these letters on Saturday, January 25, and as specified in the letters, the fine payments are due to the Borough ten (10) calendar days after receipt of the letters, which is Tuesday, February 4, 2025.
- On Monday, January 27, York County OEM sent out their 2024 annual report which can be accessed at:

- Miscellaneous:

- On Thursday, January 30, a Dallastown Area School District Bus Driver informed me that Loganville Borough's streets are cleared very well during snow storms (e.g., there's a noticeable difference when heading west and crossing into the borough from Dunkard Valley Road (PA Route 214)).
- On Thursday, January 30, after receiving complaints concerning reports of dog feces being left on a resident's property, I consulted the BC President to discuss courses of action. The Borough Nuisance Ordinance (2013-1, May 6, 2013) defines this in Section 1. A.(vii); Section 4 describes penalties ranging from \$50 to more than \$300 and costs of prosecution. As such, residents are encouraged to be good neighbors and clean up after their pets when walking them in Loganville Borough to avoid these fines.
- On Friday, January 31, I contacted MetEd to check on the status of two street light outage reports I submitted earlier in the month. The current status is listed below:
